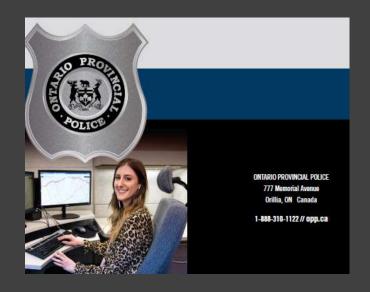

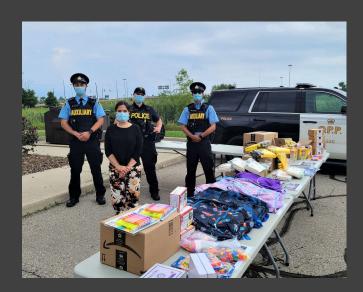

Breakdown of 2022 Budget

- 1. OPP Contract Policing
 - Base service costs allocated on property count;
 - Calls per service allocated based on rolling 4 year average (weighted by call type);
 - 27 Contract Enhancements to focus on Community Response, Street Crime, and Traffic
- 2. OPP Property Service and Equipment costs
 - Operating costs related to the OPP Facilities for Maintenance, Equipment and Utilities
- 3. Recovery from Grants
 - Community Safety and Policing Grant, Court Security and Prisoner Transportation Grant

2022 Proposed Capital Project

- · One New 2022 Capital Budget Request
 - The scope of the project to construct a new OPP satellite Office in the Seniors Centre Addition, has been increased to include the addition of back up generator for the facility to be utilized as an emergency shelter, in the event of a power failure. This phase will allow back up power Capacity and will provide an emergency shelter in the Bolton area.
 - Total budget is \$1,071,003 funded by the OPP Capital Infrastructure Reserve in the amount of \$664,000 and \$407,003 from OPP Development Charges.
- Reserve fund balances have sufficient funds to fund proposed 2022 OPP capital projects and proposed draws to fund the operating budget
 - \$5.0 million Caledon Policing Stabilization Reserve
 - \$7.2 million OPP Capital Infrastructure Reserve
