YouthREX is a province-wide initiative funded by the Ministry of Child and Youth Services to promote youth well-being

through knowledge exchange and research and evaluation capacity building.

Launched in December 2014, YouthREX's vision is an Ontario where shared knowledge is transformed into positive impact for all youth. The organization's mission is to make research evidence and evaluation practices accessible and relevant to Ontario's grassroots youth sector through capacity building, knowledge mobilization and evaluation leadership.

Based at York University in Toronto, YouthREX has five regional Hubs across Ontario. These hubs are engaging local grassroots youth serving organizations, academic partners, youth and policy stakeholders, providing customized evaluation supports, facilitating events, networking, capacity-building, knowledge sharing opportunities and more.

Peel Region falls within the YouthREX Central Region Hub led by Dr. Carl James, YouthREX Academic Director and Rebecca Houwer, Central Hub Manager, and is hosted by the York University Centre for Education and Community (YCEC). The YCEC successfully develops, implements, and disseminates community-related research, evaluation, and educational projects that address contemporary educational and social needs and issues.
