What other policies are changing?

Recently updated Provincial plans and policies have identified other areas that require changes for consistency and conformity purposes. Some of these gaps to existing policies are related to cultural heritage, Indigenous community engagement and waste management.

Cultural Heritage

Cultural heritage resources includes built heritage, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeological resources. It is important to continue the cooperative efforts that support the identification, conservation and preservation of cultural heritage and archaeological resources as they contribute to the Region's sense of place.

Background work is being conducted to support Regional Official Plan policies that will improve linkages and provide stronger direction on cultural heritage and archaeological resources policies.

Indigenous Engagement

Indigenous communities have a unique relationship with the land and its resources, through traditional knowledge. This knowledge is of value to planning decisions and processes.

Background work and ongoing consultation is being conducted to support Regional Official Plan policies that will better acknowledge Indigenous communities' unique role, perspectives and traditional knowledge in the land use planning process.

What is the policy direction and how are these policies formed?

While many of the policies have been identified as a result of updated Provincial plans, there is an opportunity to strengthen the linkages between the interests of Indigenous community and cultural heritage conservation.

Indigenous communities have been notified and involved in the Peel 2041 process since its kick-off, and efforts continue to be pursued to engage and build relationships with Indigenous communities to form draft policies and background work.
