



Planning Community Areas are comprised of existing and proposed Secondary Plan areas in Caledon and Brampton, and Character Areas in Mississauga.







NUMBER OF PEEL JOBS BY MUNICIPALITY 2016







PEEL JOBS BY EMPLOYMENT TYPE 2016







NUMBER OF PEEL BUSINESSES BY MUNICIPALITY

SUMMARY OF FACTS

Between 2014 and 2016, the number of surveyed businesses in Peel grew from 30,947 to 32,053, a growth rate of 3.6%. Caledon experienced the greatest business growth at 8.6%, while the number of businesses in Brampton grew 6.5% and Mississauga grew by 1.8%. Most businesses (47.4%) in Peel employ between one and four employees.

In 2016, there were approximately 623,000 jobs in Peel, up 4.4% from 597,000 jobs reported in 2014.

The majority (76.1%) of Peel's employment are full-time positions, up 2.2% from 2014. Between 2014 and 2016, employment growth was seen most in contract positions (58.2%).

In 2016, the top three sectors for employment were in manufacturing, transportation & warehousing and wholesale trade. The top three sectors for Peel businesses were retail trade, other services (except public administration) and manufacturing.

Values presented in this bulletin are based on adjusted total employment figures from surveyed businesses in the Region of Peel and may differ from values reported by the area municipalities.

Part-time employment has been adjusted. Part-time jobs are divided by two and numerous part-time jobs are factored in by multiplying part-time employment by 0.1.

The estimated number of agricultural businesses and jobs are derived by taking values from the 2011 Census of Agriculture and subtracting them from values reported in the employment survey.

Estimated work from home jobs are derived from applying the 2011 National Household Survey work from home proportion of the total population to a 2016 population estimate.
