What are Major Transit Station Areas?

Major Transit Station Areas are lands within an approximate 500-800 metre radius (a 10-minute walk) of a transit station or stop, primarily along existing or planned transit corridors (e.g. GO Train, Light Rail Transit, Bus Rapid Transit). MTSAs are intended to be developed as higher density, mixed-use, transitsupportive neighbourhoods that provide access to local amenities, jobs, housing, and recreation opportunities.
